10. Thinking Skill: Distinguishing Different Perspectives –

At the beginning of the story, Mrs. Jones was aggressive. She kicked Roger, then grabbed him, and dragged him to her house for trying to steal her purse. **However**, later in the story, she acted in a **different** way than what we might expect.

Mrs. Jones understood that Roger had no one to take care of him or to teach him how to behave. She chose to act like a parent and make sure he was clean and fed. She gave him money to buy the shoes he wanted and taught him a lesson: not to steal.

Thinking Skill: Explaining Cause and Effect –

Mrs. Jones changed her behavior toward Roger **because** she also did things in her past that she was not proud of. She wanted to show this to Roger and make him see that she was not going to judge him. Mrs. Jones understood that Roger had no one to take care of him or to teach him how to behave, **so** she behaved like a parent and made sure he was clean and fed.

The Treasure of Lemon Brown

11. In the story The Treasure of Lemon Brown , Lemon Brown's treasure was not something of monetary value. His treasure was the love and respect of his son.
