15. The Road Not Taken

Leonardo Da Vinci's quote states that he walked along the countryside trying to find answers to what was unknown to him.

This quote connects to the The Road Not Taken because in the poem we see a traveler who stands, contemplating which path to choose. He stands in front of the fork in the road for a long time, trying to think which of the roads will be the right choice; which will be the choice to make a change in his life.

Like Da Vinci, the traveler finds himself in nature, staring down both paths, contemplating how one's life might be affected. The traveler thinks about which direction each road will take him, what does the future hold, and the paths ahead – a question to which the answer remains unknown.
